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MASTERCLASS OUTLINE

Executive coaching has achieved a great deal in the last 40 years in providing bespoke personal development. Now the need is to deliver impact through systemic individual and systemic team coaching that creates value for all the client's stakeholders.

This session will first describe how systemic coaching and systemic team coaching is different from other forms of coaching and team development and then present models and approaches which will immediately increase the ripple effect of your coaching work.

We will examine how we can serve wider stakeholders beyond our clients and including the more-than-human-world of the wider ecology in our work. How do we move coaching beyond “delivering very expensive personal development for the already highly privileged” and deliver beneficial impact to all stakeholders including the ecology? Together we will consider: what is our role as coaches and supervisors, what could it be and what should it be?

Everyone will leave with clear plans on how they can increase the benefit that their coachees' stakeholders receive from the coaching; carry out more effective multi-stakeholder contracting; appropriately bring an ecological focus into every coaching assignment; increase the beneficial impact they have in the wider world. You will gain an understanding of the nature of systemic coaching and systemic team coaching and how they can support all of the above and learn how to increase one's personal capacity and resilience and work less from effort and more from 'source'.

Why what made coaching successful in the last 40 years is not fit for the mid-21st century; introducing systemic stakeholder coaching; exploring eco-engaged coaching and considering challenges and how we can increase our impact.
